3 Your kingdom come, we humbly pray,  
That Christ may rule in us today  
And that your Holy Spirit bring Still  
more to worship Christ as King.  
Break Satan's pow'r, defeat his rage;  
Preserve your Church from age to age.

4 Your gracious will on earth be done  
Just as in heav'n around your throne,  
That patiently we may obey  
Throughout our lives all that you say.  
Curb sinful flesh and ev'ry ill  
That sets itself against your will.

That we may live in godly peace.
